## Art show shines

Perrysburg show in Levis Commons fares well despite rain

PERRYSBURG — The skies may have been overcast Sunday, but the long-range forecast for the Levis Commons Fine Art Fair was sunny.

"This is a good show that's going to become a great show," said Max Clayton, the executive director of the Guild of Artists and Artisans, the event's producer. The Guild is best known for its production of the Ann Arbor Art Fair.

Clayton said Sunday afternoon that the two-day art fair appeared to be on track to draw the 30,000 visitors it had hoped for. That would be 10,000 more than it drew in 2005, the fair's first year.

The 145 artists, she said, were reporting mixed results. "Some are doing phenomenally well," she said. "Some are doing just well enough to consider coming back."

That's not unusual for artists at fairs nowadays, she said. "The economy is not their friend."

The economy aside, she said, "I love the support the community's shown. They're here. They're bringing their children. That's great. They see it as a community event, and they're coming out to support it."

Former Perrysburg mayor Reeve Kelsey, who was at Levis with his daughter Elizabeth and wife, Betsy, said the event was a welcomed addition to the city. "It (See ART on 14)
